What You'll Need

- 1 sheet of 7-count plastic canvas
- 1 skein of red yarn
- 1 skein of green yarn
- 1 skein of white yarn
- 1 skein of gold yarn
- 1 tapestry needle

- Scissors

Instructions

1. Start by cutting a piece of plastic canvas that is 11 inches wide by 8 inches high. This will be the main body of the tissue box cover.

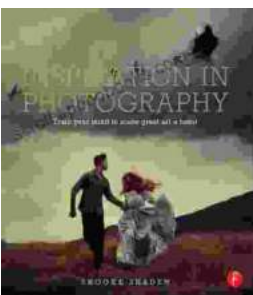
